The Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) looks at the extent to which an area (usually referred to as a small area or data zone) is ‘deprived’ across seven domains: income, employment, education, health, access to services, crime and housing. If an area is identified as ‘deprived’, this can relate to people having a low income, but it can also mean fewer resources or opportunities.

Technical note

Settlements and localities represent the urban or built-up areas of Scotland. National Records of Scotland (NRS) define settlements groups of adjacent, densely populated postcode areas that add up to 500 people or more. They are separated by low density postcodes. Larger settlements are sometimes divided into localities. Localities correspond to the historical towns of Scotland.

For the purposes of this profile, each settlement is built up from the aggregation of 2011 data zones. This is different from the NRS definition, which is built up from postcodes, but is as close as possible to get based on best fit to whole data zones.
